Registration for the 2020 Bank of America Chicago 13.1 and 41<sup>st</sup> annual Bank of America Shamrock Shuffle will open at 10 a.m. (Central Time) on Monday, October 7, 2019. The registration fee for the Chicago 13.1 and Shamrock Shuffle will start at \$95 and \$39, respectively. Registration for the 2020 Chicago Marathon will be announced at a later date.
